The Position

Through advocacy, development, spiritual support, and coordination of cultural, educational and social programs and activities, Muslim Life at Wake Forest seeks to create a safe environment that promotes a rich cross-cultural experience for the entire campus community. The Associate Chaplain for Muslim Life encourages Muslim and non-Muslims to identify common values and negotiate differences in public life.

Qualifications

Bachelor's degree required—preferably in closely-related field or the liberal arts. Degree required in a program recognized as a Master of Divinity equivalent with a focus area of study in Islamic studies. Graduate Certificate in Islamic Chaplaincy.
